

Coronation School is a K - 12 public school supporting the education of 230 students. The school has a professional staff of 13.884 teachers and a support staff of 6.8 including our IA instructor, learning commons coordinator, administrative assistant and play school teacher.

The budget for the year is set at \$1,923,108. Coronation School is attempting to rebuild our reserves this year by maintaining a slim staffing profile, and combining our Gr. 2 and 3 classes.



Decoding Results 2023-2024






Background

During our community engagement meeting in the spring of 2024 we learned that staff, parent, and other stakeholders continue to identify literacy skills as one of the most significant priority areas of focus for Clearview in our planning and preparation for 2023-2024. During the 2023-2024, staff have utilized the 3T testing and have seen excellent growth in Comprehension, Fluency and

Decoding.








Success Measures

- Grade 3-12 students, including self-identified First Nations, Metis and Inuit (FNMI) students and English Language Learners (ELL), will demonstrate 1+ years growth in reading comprehension skills as measured by the STAR Reading Assessment in the fall 2022 assessment as compared to the fall of 2021
- All Grade K-12 students will participate in the 3T testing
- A writing committee at the school (HLAT) will be formed to assess writing skills and set benchmarks for writing.




