4. Board report

Spring Symposium-April 26th-\$100- theme resilience-ASCA website-deadline April 14th, eligible to pay for with school council grant if anyone on School council wants to attend. There is a potential scholarship for students in Coronation and Castor going into an ag related field. At the Local Government Engagement Meeting there was discussions to create a Regional/Rural return bursary program to attract and retain people to come back and work in rural communities. They are hoping to get local governments and boards involved in a big way. (ex) ag, trades, medical fields. Alberta budget announcements indicate increased funding is tied to enrollment growth. Our area has declining enrollment.

a. <u>Next year discussions</u>

Enrollment has steadily declined over the last 10 years. We have slowly been reducing staff when we could. However, next year we will only have an average of 12 students per grade. Therefore, Coronation School will need to reconfigure our grades into K, 1/2, 3/4, 5/6, 7/8, and 9. Ultimetely, we are eliminating 1.5 teachers, by covering a Kindergarten maternity leave internally and letting go of one probationary contract. The high school still has healthy numbers, but will need to look at solutions in the next 3-4 years.

7. Old Business

a. Alberta School Council Engagement Grant-\$500- We plan to save up two years and then pick a project. Ideas:lego, Musulla theater, Care Closet–Table for September.
